The Last Supper

Milan's most famous mural, Leonardo da Vinci's The Last Supper, is hidden away on a wall of the refectory adjoining the Basilica di Santa Maria delle Grazie. One of the world's most iconic images, to see it you must book in advance. Get your tickets early to avoid missing out.

Duomo di Milano

The Duomo is one of the largest cathedrals in Italy and Europe. Besides being an artistic monument, it is also a privileged place of prayer. Book a guided tour, and be accompanied by an expert whilst you take in its splendour.

Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II

Make sure to head over to this vibrant, extravagant shopping mall for a spot of retail therapy and for your chance to sit back amongst the hustle and bustle of the city. This 19th century glass-topped, barrel-vaulted tunnel, is bursting with colour, life and high-end boutiques. People-watch from one of the Galleria's many bars and restaurants and watch the world go by.

Day trip to Lake Como
